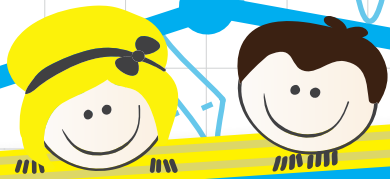

ART COMPETITION

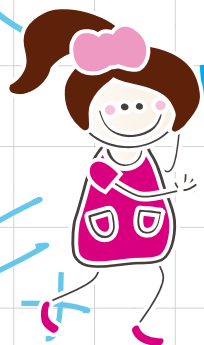

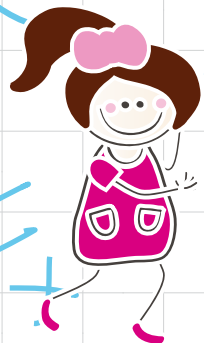
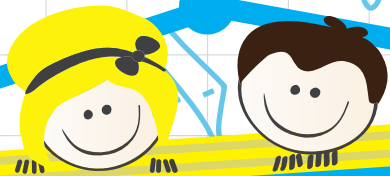


FAREWELL PARTY
