LOHRI CELEBRATION






With the circle of fire, the surroundings are lighted up.

Students of our school once again performed brilliantly. They have added another golden feather to the school's cap as they won international, state and zonal awards.


Parth Mehta (Grade I) bagged International ranking 1 in International English Olympiad and got International Topper Gold Medal.
